On his first operational sortie with 64 Squadron on 6 September K9903 during a routine patrol, writing off the aircraft but emerging unacathed.

He was posted to 19 Squadron, Fowlmere, on 12 September and scored his first victory on 5 November, when he claimed a Bf 109. He made further claims on Bf 109s des and 7 August 1941. He was awarded the DFM (7 April A942), when he ende Squadron.

Following his posting to 72 Squadron in August 1942, he moved to Gibraltas where we and later Algiers, conducting patrols. From 25 November to 18 December, he claimed a FW 190, four Bf 109s and another probable Bf 109.

On 18 December, he landed in enemy territory, after being shot down, and bribed and Arab to lead him to British lines, whence he was admitted to hospital.

Commissioned from Warrant Officer in January 1943, he received the DFC on 26 February and rejoined his squadron on 17 March.

Charnock returned to the Uk t join 57 OTU, Eshot, in November. After a stint at 61 OTU, Rednal, he went to AFDU Wittering in January 1944 and then joined 222 Squadron in July.

Two days after joining them, he had an RTA and did not return to Ops until 1945, when he joined 41 Squadron at Volkel as a Flight Commander.

He left the RAF on 24 November 1945, as a Flight Lieutenant, was awarded the Croix de Guerre and created a Chevalier of the Order of Leopold II aves Palme by the Belgians.

He died on 24 May 1974.
