# DISCLAIMER

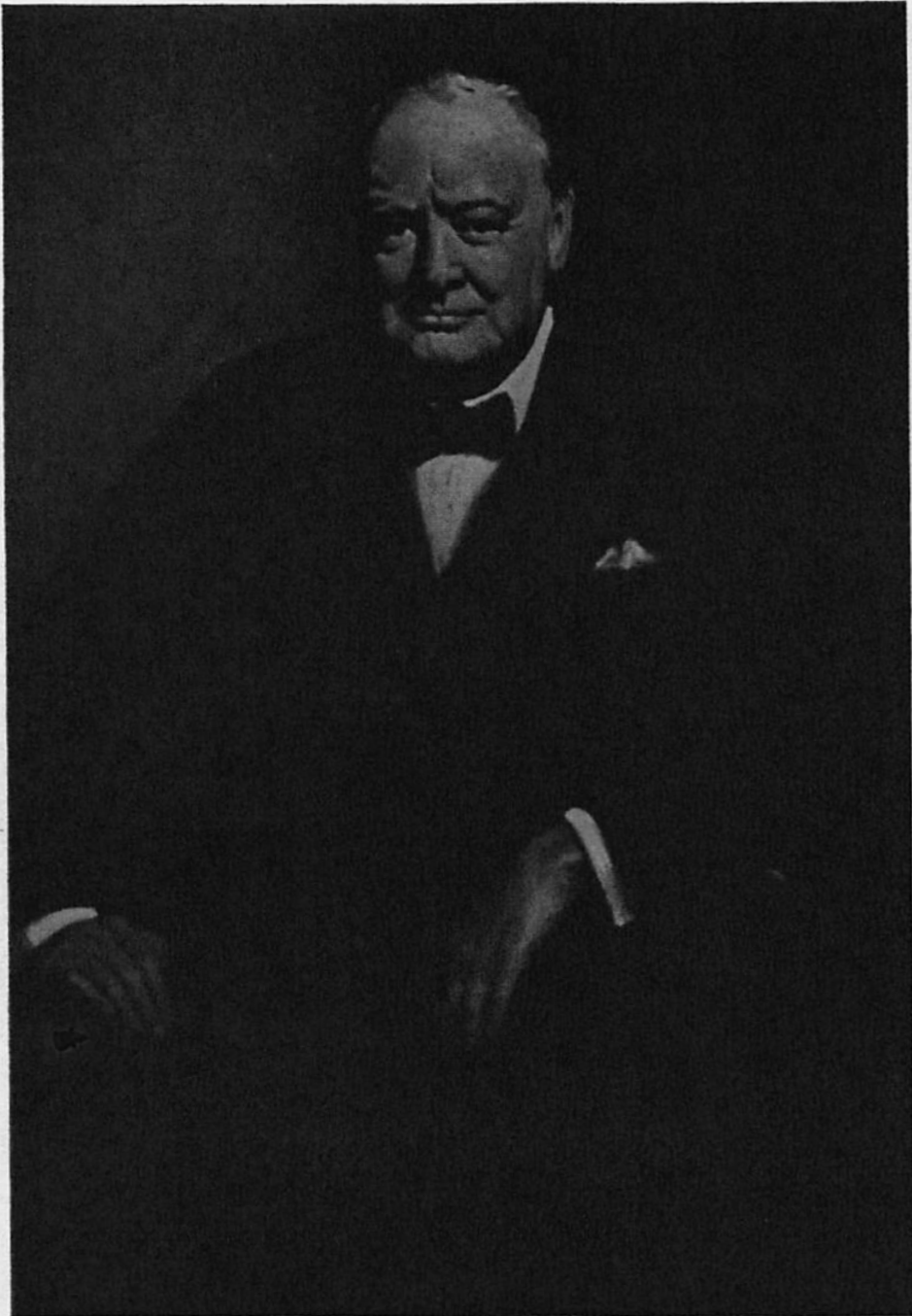

# Summer 1965 - A Tribute to Airmen



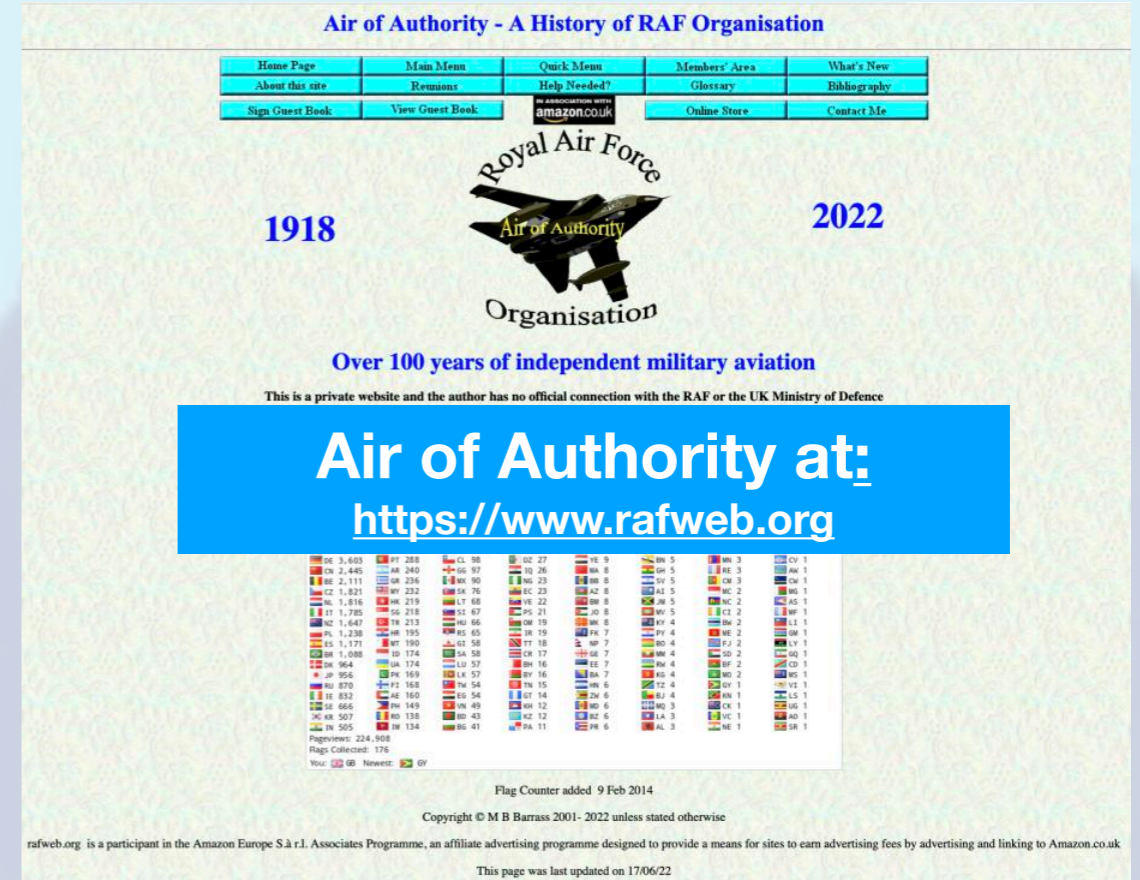

**WING-COMMANDER L. W. B. REES, V.C.,  
O.B.E., M.C., A.F.C.  
OFFICER COMMANDING FLYING WING.**

On 1st July 1916 at Double Crassieus, France, Major Rees, whilst on flying duties, sighted what he thought was a bombing party of our machines returning home, but were in fact enemy aircraft. Major Rees was attacked by one of them, but after a short encounter it disappeared, damaged. The others then attacked him at long range, but he dispersed them, seriously damaging two of the machines. He chased two others but was wounded in the thigh, temporarily losing control of his aircraft. He righted it and closed with the enemy, using up all his ammunition, firing at very close range. He then returned home, landing his aircraft safely.

Medical examination showed that Rees had been fortunate in not having a leg artery severed, and he spent several weeks in hospital, and ended up with a slight but permanent limp. On 5th August 1916, came the news of his Victoria Cross award, which he received from King George V on 14th December 1916. When fit again for duty, he was promoted to Lieutenant Colonel on 1st May 1917 and travelled to the USA as part of Harold Balfour's Mission entourage. On his return, he was given command of No 1 School of Aerial Fighting, Turnberry, Ayrshire. He remained at Turnberry for the rest of the war, and was awarded the Air Force Cross on 2nd November 1918, and decorated with an OBE.

In 1919, he was granted a permanent commission as a Wing Commander. On 15th January 1920 he was given the Freedom of Caernarfon, and presented with an ornate Sword of Honour. In 1923-1924, he became Assistant Commandant to the newly created RAF College, Cranwell; and in 1925 he commenced a two years' stint in the Directorate of Training, at the Air Ministry, and appointed ADC to King George V. In April 1926, he was posted to the Middle East as Group Captain, in command. He later commanded the RAF Depot at Uxbridge.

Born 4 Sep 84, at Mossel Bay, South Africa, Proctor voluntarily enlisted in the Duke of Edinburgh's Own Rifles ("The Dukes") as No 6348 Signaller Proctor for active service in the German South-West Africa campaign on 1 Oct 1914; despite being only 5ft 2in. As a Corporal airman, he was allegedly a much better shot than an aviator. His exploits are recounted below in an extract from the VCOonline link above, including his posting to Cranwell in 1919 and commissioning as a Flt Lt. He is arguably the most decorated Cranwellian to date. (Note the old DFC ribbon.)

March 1918 saw Proctor claim eight victories, and on 1st April he was now part of the newly formed Royal Air Force, and he was promoted to Lieutenant. On the 8th he was further promoted to Captain and given command of C Flight, 84 Squadron – recognition of his abilities. On 12th April he claimed a pair of German single-seaters as out of control; and on the 20th drove down a two-seater behind German lines. His most successful month was May 1918 when he claimed 14 victories, and the month culminated with the award of the Military Cross (gazetted 22nd June). By the end of May, he was credited with 24 victories. In the first week of June, he had added another eight before leaving for a spell of leave. On the 3rd August he was awarded the newly instituted DFC.

On return from leave, he took over a new SE5A and showed his prowess. By the 11th August, he had claimed another six victories. By the 22nd August, his tally stood at 40, and he was recommended for a third gallantry award – a Bar to his MC, which was gazetted on 16th September 1918. He added another six victims before the end of the month. Throughout September, he concentrated on low level fighting and four destroyed kite balloons were his only success. By the 5th October a further six had been claimed before his final war sortie on 8th October.

Just before noon on the 8th, he sent a Rumpler two-seater down to crash near Marez; but as he turned for home he was set upon by 8 German fighters. In the ensuing combat he was hit badly in the arm, and barely managed to escape death and eventually return to his own aerodrome. Receiving immediate medical attention, he was then invalided back to England, where he was sent to the Northumberland Hospital to recuperate. He was also in the recommendation for a DSO and this was officially rubber-stamped in November 1918. Added to this was a recommendation from his CO, Sholto Douglas that the South African pilot – in his own words “that little man who had the guts of a lion” – be awarded the VC.

Almost three weeks after the Armistice, the London Gazette of 30th November 1918 confirmed his VC, the citation crediting him with 54 victories, one-third of all 84 Squadron victories of the Great War. Discharged from hospital in March 1919, he joined a mission to the USA, where he toured various cities lecturing to help raise funds for the US “Liberty Loan”; and then on his return to England in July 1919, he was posted to Lee-on-Solent, Hampshire for a course in piloting seaplanes. He was then posted to Cranwell, where he granted a permanent commission, with Flight Lieutenant rank, in the RAF. On 27th November 1919 he was presented with his VC, DSO and DFC by King George V at Buckingham Palace.

# Hugh Gordon MALCOLM VC

Born at Broughty Ferry, Dundee, Malcolm entered the Royal Air Force College Cranwell on 9 January 1936.

In January 1938 he joined 26 (Army Co-operation) squadron at Catterick. In May 1939 he suffered a serious head injury in a Westland Lysander crash. When the war started Malcolm was serving with No 17 Training Group.

On 4 March 1941 he was promoted to Flight Lieutenant and was Air Liaison officer on General Bernard Montgomery's general staff.

By the end of 1941 he had risen to the rank of Squadron Leader and joined No 18 Squadron as a flight commander, flying the Bristol Blenheim based in Suffolk, UK.

## ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to confer the VICTORIA CROSS on the under-mentioned officer in recognition of most conspicuous bravery:—

Acting Wing Commander Hugh Gordon MALCOLM (33322) (deceased), No. 18 Squadron.

This officer commanded a squadron of light bombers in North Africa. Throughout his service in that theatre his leadership, skill and daring were of the highest order.

On 17th November, 1942, he was detailed to carry out a low-level formation attack on Bizerta airfield, taking advantage of cloud cover. Twenty miles from the target the sky became clear, but Wing Commander Malcolm carried on, knowing well the danger of proceeding without a fighter escort. Despite fierce opposition, all bombs were dropped within the airfield perimeter. A Junkers 52 and a Messerschmitt 109 were shot down; many dispersed enemy aircraft were raked by machine gun fire. Weather conditions became extremely unfavourable and as a result, two of his aircraft were lost by collision; another was forced down by enemy fighters. It was due to this officer's skilful and resolute leadership that the remaining aircraft returned safely to base.

On 28th November, 1942, he again led his squadron against Bizerta airfield which was bombed from a low altitude. The airfield on this occasion was heavily defended and intense and accurate anti-aircraft fire was met. Nevertheless, after his squadron had released their bombs, Wing Commander Malcolm led them back again and again to attack the airfield with machine gun fire.

These were typical of every sortie undertaken by this gallant officer; each attack was pressed to an effective conclusion how-

ever difficult the task and however formidable the opposition.

Finally, on 4th December, 1942, Wing Commander Malcolm, having been detailed to give close support to the First Army, received an urgent request to attack an enemy fighter airfield near Chougui. Wing Commander Malcolm knew that to attack such an objective without a fighter escort—which could not be arranged in the time available—would be to court almost certain disaster; but believing the attack to be necessary for the success of the Army's operations, his duty was clear. He decided to attack. He took off with his squadron and reached the target unmolested, but when he had successfully attacked it, his squadron was intercepted by an overwhelming force of enemy fighters. Wing Commander Malcolm fought back, controlling his hard-pressed squadron and attempting to maintain formation. One by one his aircraft were shot down until only his own aircraft remained. In the end he, too, was shot down in flames.

Wing Commander Malcolm's last exploit was the finest example of the valour and unswerving devotion to duty which he constantly displayed.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

*Second Bar to Distinguished Flying Cross.*

Acting Squadron Leader Lance WADE, D.F.C. (68717), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 145 Squadron.

This officer is the leader of a squadron which has achieved much success in recent operations. During March, 1943, the squadron destroyed 21 enemy aircraft, 4 of which were shot down by Squadron Leader Wade. By his great skill and daring, this officer has contributed materially to the high standard of operational efficiency of the squadron he commands. Squadron Leader Wade has destroyed 19 enemy aircraft.

## Kenneth Campbell VC

b. 21/04/1917 Saltcoats, Scotland. d. 06/04/1941 Brest, France.

Kenneth "Ken" Campbell (1917-1941) was born on 21st April 1917 at Saltcoats, Ayrshire, Scotland, the youngest of a family of six children, and attended Sedbergh School before gaining entrance to Clare College, Cambridge, to study for a degree in Chemistry. Joining the Cambridge University Air Squadron, he had been commissioned as a Pilot Officer in the RAF Volunteer Reserve on 23rd August 1938, and eventually mobilised for RAF service on 25th September 1939.

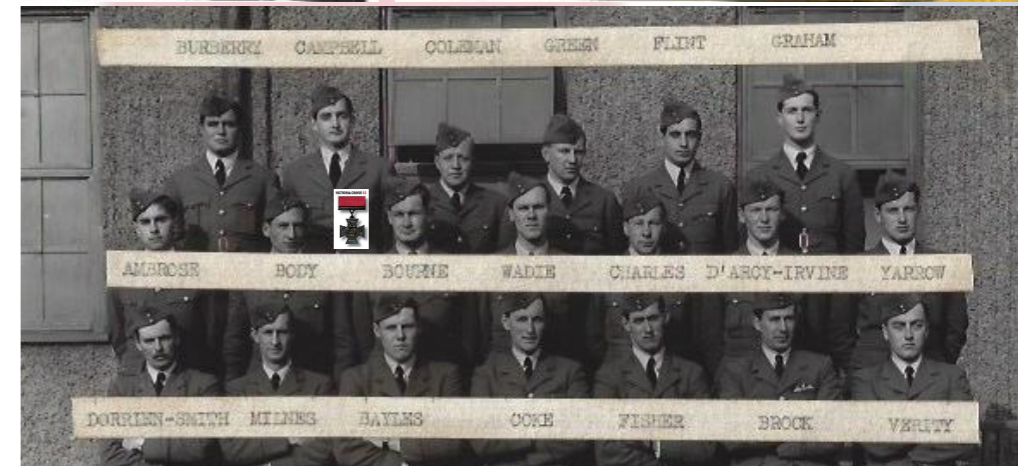
A brief course of Service training at RAF Cranwell commenced on 21st October 1939 and was followed by a move to RAF Abbotsinch on 20th April 1940; by which time Campbell had been promoted to Flying Officer. On 8th June, he completed his training with a posting to No 1 OTU; and on 28th September 1940 joined 22 Squadron to start his operational career. The non-stop Battle of the Atlantic then being waged saw him quickly introduced to the role of 22 Squadron; attacking enemy shipping at every opportunity.

On 6th April 1941, over Brest Harbour, France, Flying Officer Campbell attacked the German battleship Gneisenau. He flew his Bristol Beaufort through the gauntlet of concentrated anti-aircraft fire from about 1000 weapons of all calibers and launched a torpedo at a height of 50 feet (15 m).

The attack had to be made with absolute precision: the Gneisenau was moored only some 500 yards (460 m) away from a mole in Brest's inner harbour. For the attack to be effective Campbell would have to time the release to drop the torpedo close to the side of the mole. That Campbell managed to launch his torpedo accurately is testament to his courage and determination. The ship was severely damaged below the waterline and was obliged to return to the dock whence she had come only the day before, she was out of action for 6 months, which thus allowed allied shipping to cross the Atlantic without any threat.

Generally, once a torpedo was dropped an escape was made by low-level jinking at full throttle. Because of rising ground surrounding the harbour Flying Officer Campbell's Beaufort was forced into a steep banking turn, revealing its full silhouette to the gunners. The aircraft met a withering wall of flak and crashed into the harbour.

When the aircraft was later salvaged the Germans found the body of "Jimmy" Scott, the Canadian navigator, in the pilot's seat, normally occupied by Campbell. All four crew members were buried by the Germans in the grave of honour in Brest Cemetery. Reports of Ken Campbell's devotion to his designated task, and the courage he showed in completing his attack in the face of unnerving odds filtered through to England from local French patriots; and on 13th March 1942 Campbell was awarded a posthumous Victoria Cross, which his parents received from King George VI at an investiture on 23rd June 1943. A memorial was erected in his memory at Sedbergh where he spent his schooldays.

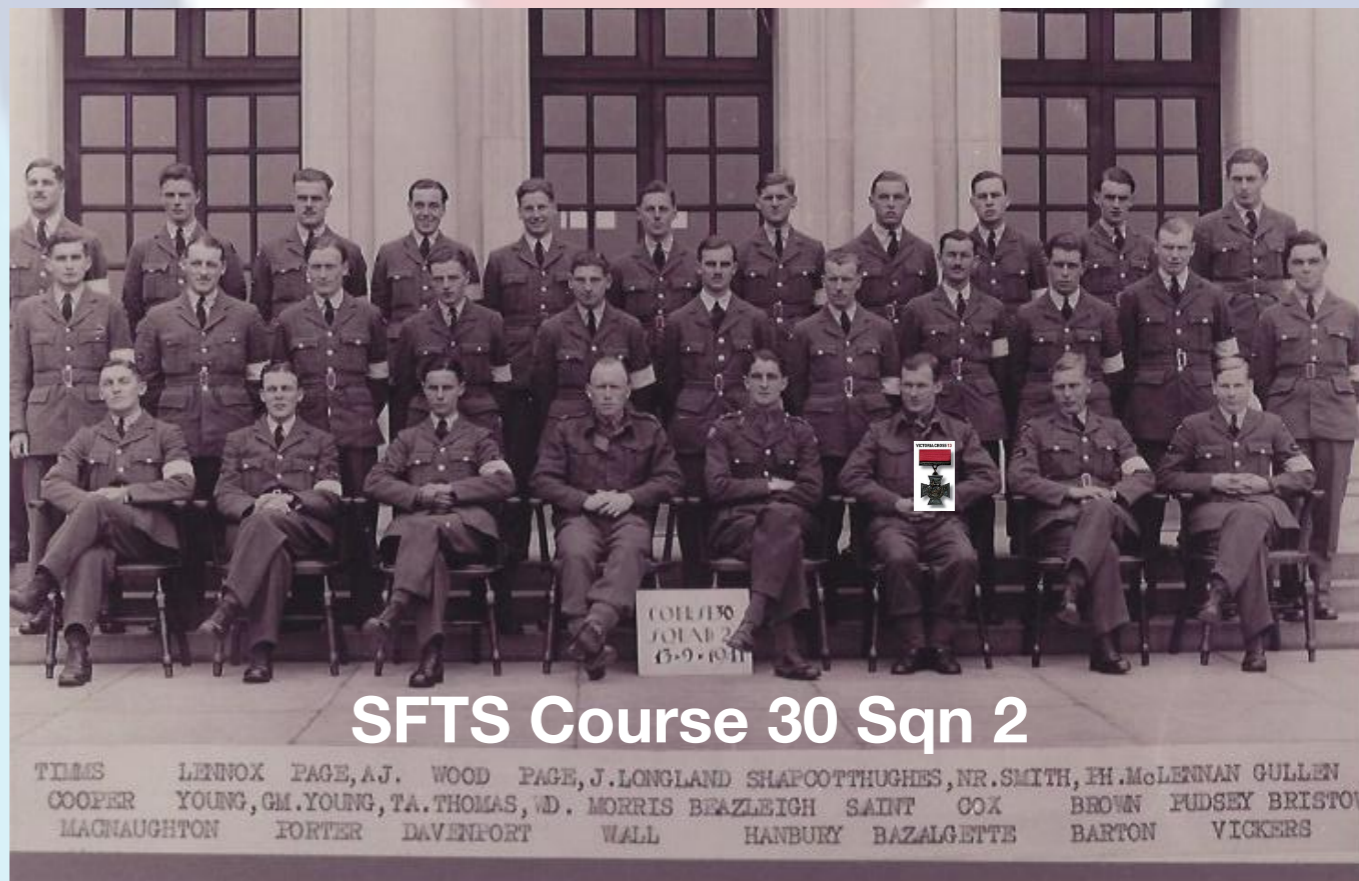


## VC Citation (London Gazette):

"On 4th August, 1944, Squadron Leader Bazalgette was 'Master Bomber' of a Pathfinder Squadron detailed to mark an important target at Trossy-St. Maximin for the main bomber force. When nearing the target his Lancaster came under heavy anti-aircraft fire. Both starboard engines were put out of action and serious fires broke out in the fuselage, and the starboard main-plane. The bomb aimer was badly wounded. As the deputy master bomber had already been shot down, the success of the attack depended on Squadron Leader Bazalgette, and this he knew. Despite the appalling conditions in his burning aircraft, he pressed on gallantly to the target, marking and bombing it accurately. That the attack was successful was due to his magnificent effort. After the bombs had been dropped the Lancaster dived, practically out of control. By expert airmanship and great exertion Squadron Leader Bazalgette regained control. But the port inner engine then failed and the whole of the starboard mainplane became a mass of flames. Squadron Leader Bazalgette fought bravely to bring his aircraft and crew to safety. The mid-upper gunner was overcome by fumes. Squadron Leader Bazalgette then ordered those of his crew who were able to leave by parachute to do so. He remained at the controls and attempted the almost hopeless task of landing the crippled and blazing aircraft in a last effort to save the wounded bomb aimer and helpless gunner. With superb skill, and taking great care to avoid a small French village nearby, he brought the aircraft down safely. Unfortunately, it then exploded and this gallant officer and his two comrades perished. His heroic sacrifice marked the climax of a long career of operations against the enemy. He always chose the more dangerous and exacting roles. His courage and devotion to duty were beyond praise."

## GC ACTION

On 11 Feb 40, the SS Kildare was hit by two bombs. One exploded in the grain cargo, which shifted, causing the ship to list heavily; the other lodged in the after deck cabin, but did not explode. The ship limped into Immingham Dock.

Dowland-Ryan, with Armament Instructor Leonard Harrison GC, fitted a voltmeter to drain the electric charge. The locking rings were removed and the defused bomb was lowered into a truck for further examination.

In Jun 40, Dowland-Ryan performed a similar feat of bravery with the same efficiency and promptitude on board a trawler.

He was killed in action near Malta in 1942.

## GC ACTION

On 30 Sep 40, a Blenheim bomber was taking off from RAF Wattisham when one engine cut out and the bomber crashed in flames.

Sinclair immediately went to the scene to help, but two 250lb bombs exploded before he reached it. Undeterred, and knowing full well that there were two more 250lb bombs on board, he pressed on and dashed into the burning wreck.

Of the three crew, he was able to drag out the air gunner, Sergeant Walters, and take him to an ambulance. Unfortunately, he died from his injuries. The pilot, Sergeant J Merrett was killed.

The navigator, Sergeant Byron, survived, but Sinclair did not discover this for 50 years.

It is recorded in some circles that, when a cadet of J28 Entry at the RAF College, Gp Capt McKechnie was awarded the George Cross for saving the life of fellow student, CJ Giles. The citation is appended to the right.

In fact, Cadet Sergeant McKechnie was awarded the Empire Gallantry Medal (EGM), the left of the two medals pictured above, by the King on 18 October 1929. This medal, first introduced in 1922, was the Gallantry equivalent of the BEM awarded for meritorious service and introduced at the same time. On the King's instructions, the EGM was superseded by the George Cross on the 23 September 1940 and placed second in order of merit only to the Victoria Cross. In April 1941, all living recipients of the EGM were instructed to exchange their insignia for the George Cross.

Gp Capt McKechnie was shot down on the night of 29/30 August 1944 over Königsberg, when piloting a Lancaster Mk III of 106 Sqn which exploded on impact.

On the 20th June, 1929, an aeroplane piloted by Flight Cadet C. J. Giles crashed on landing at Cranwell Aerodrome and burst into flames. The pilot was stunned but managed to release his safety belt and fall out of the machine in a dazed condition. Flight Cadet McKechnie, who had landed in another aeroplane about the same time some two hundred yards away, left his machine and ran at full speed towards the scene of the accident. The petrol had spread over an area of about ten yards diameter in full blaze, with Giles lying in it, semi-conscious. McKechnie, without hesitation, ran into the flames and pulled out Giles, who was badly burned about the legs and face, with his Sidcot suit and clothes actually burning. After dragging him clear of the flames, during the process of which he was scorched and superficially burned, McKechnie proceeded to extinguish the flames of Giles' burning clothing.

By this time, the machine was in full blaze, with the petrol spreading along the ground so that without McKechnie's assistance, there is no doubt Giles would have been burned to death, as he was quite incapable of moving himself.

Ultimately the machine was entirely destroyed by fire and the ground for some distance around was completely burned up by the spread of the ignited petrol.

This officer and airman displayed courageous conduct when an aircraft, with a full load of bombs, crashed and burst into flames one night in May, 1941. They succeeded in extricating two of the crew who were trapped in the aircraft, while the bombs were actually exploding.

### Also on 4 May 1941:

### In Iraq:

Although Rashid Ali's troops kept shelling Habbaniya, they balked at storming the base. Their confidence was further undermined by the arrival of four Blenheim Mk.IVf fighters from No. 203 Squadron on May 3. Eight of No. 37 Squadron's Wellingtons bombed buildings and strafed aircraft at Rashid on May 4 but lost a plane to a combination of 20mm groundfire and an Iraqi Gladiator of No. 4 Squadron. The Wellington crew was taken prisoner. Two Blenheim Mk.IVf's from Habbaniya also strafed Iraqi aircraft at Rashid and Baghdad airfields. At that same time, six Vickers Valentias and six Douglas DC-2s of No. 31 Squadron were flying troops into Iraq and ferrying out civilian evacuees. One of the DC-2s flew into Habbaniya with, among other supplies, ammunition for a couple of World War I-era fieldpieces that for years had stood as ornaments outside the officers' mess. To the garrison's surprise the old guns proved still operable, and when they opened up on the plateau, the Iraqis were convinced the British were being reinforced with artillery. The trainers only flew 53 sorties that day, but they also flew night missions to deprive their besiegers of sleep.

### Elsewhere:

Hitler makes a ranting speech to the Reichstag in the course of which he says that the decision to send British troops to Greece was one of the most notable mistakes of this war. [Note weeks before arguably his biggest mistake, opening a second front against the USSR in Operation BARBAROSSA. He also utters the glaring lie that the German casualties in Greece were about 5,000 - about one eighth of the true figure.

President Roosevelt reiterates his faith in democracy and adds the highly important pronouncement that lie in his favour of ensuring delivery of cargoes to Britain, whether by convoy, aeroplane accompaniment, or any other method which experts may advise.

The Germans attack Merseyside for the fourth night in succession, but seven German bombers are destroyed.
