Context

The Royal Air Force was formed on 1 April 1918, from the amalgamation of the Royal Flying Corps and the Royal Naval Air Service. Our founder, MRAF Viscount Trenchard, possessed the vision that extended beyond the formation of a strategic independent air force, the first of its kind, to include the creation of the requisite support infrastructure, including Officer training at RAF Cranwell, Apprenticeship training at RAF Halton and the RAF Staff College at Andover.

Implementing his vision, the RAF assumed responsibility for Officer training at Cranwell from the Royal Navy on 1 November 1919. On 5 February 1920, the RAF College was 'open for business' assembling its first officer training course, "F20", from a cohort of Army and Navy 'would be' pilots. For the next two decades, all Entries would be referenced by month and year of entry, "MY Y", with two courses initiated each year, usually in January and September, and each officer training course lasting a period of two years.

By the outbreak of the Second World War, some 964 UK Flight Cadets had entered the RAF College on 36 Entries. Another 134 cadets from the next six Entries, however, had their training abruptly terminated, the College being closed for officer training as soon as war was declared. Some of these, like AH Humphrey (later MRAF Sir Andrew Humphrey), were enlisted as airmen u/t pilots to complete their flying training at the Service Flying Training School (SFTS) set up on the same eventful day at RAF Cranwell. Of the earlier graduates, many had already retired, withdrawn, died or been killed in the inevitable flying accidents of those pioneering days of flight. So, by 3 September 1939, there remained a total of 793 former Flight Cadets in the RAF, ready to serve their country.

For College 100, we created a definitive WWII Roll of Honour: Volume 1 covering flight cadet losses; Volume 2 covering the losses of airmen trained at the SFTS Cranwell during the war. Retrospectively, we analysed the records of pre-war flight cadets to establish a Roll of Honour (of sorts) for those who lost their lives before the Second World War. Throughout the 1920s and 30s, flight was still a comparatively new phenomenon with brave men and women exploring and testing the boundaries. Inevitably, many lost their lives in those exploits and it was no different for many pilots who trained at the RAF College during those two decades.

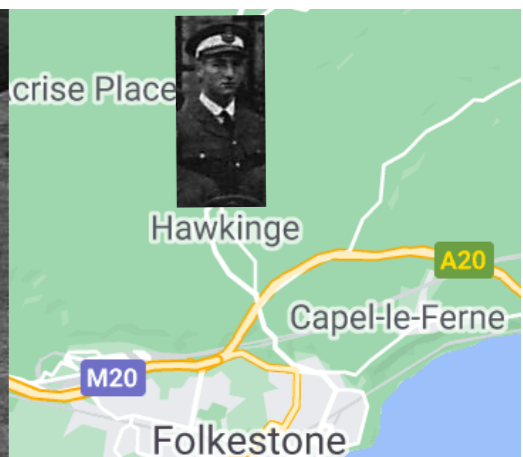
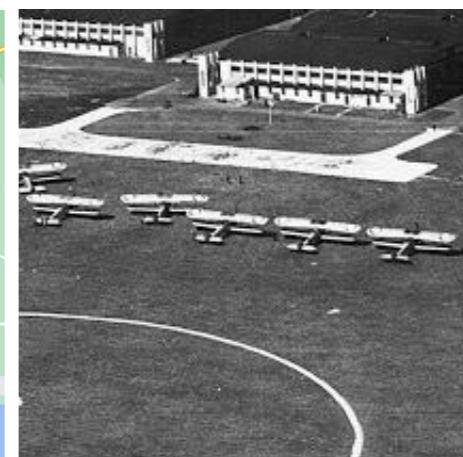
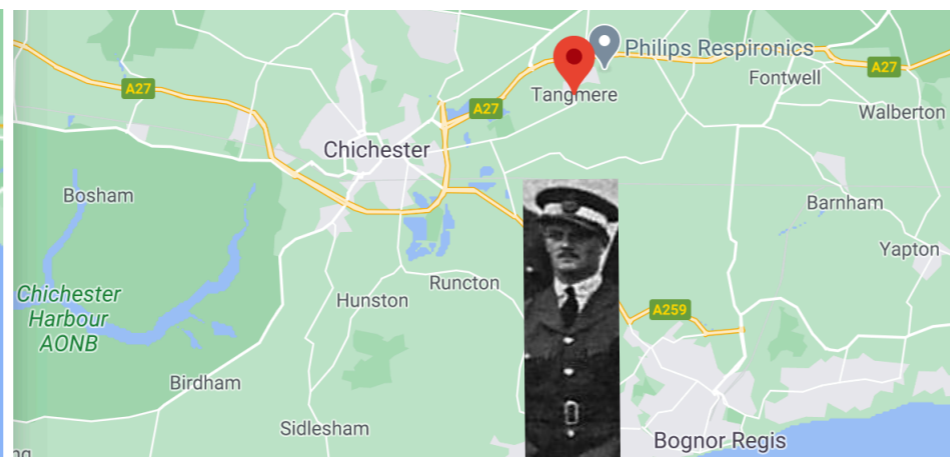
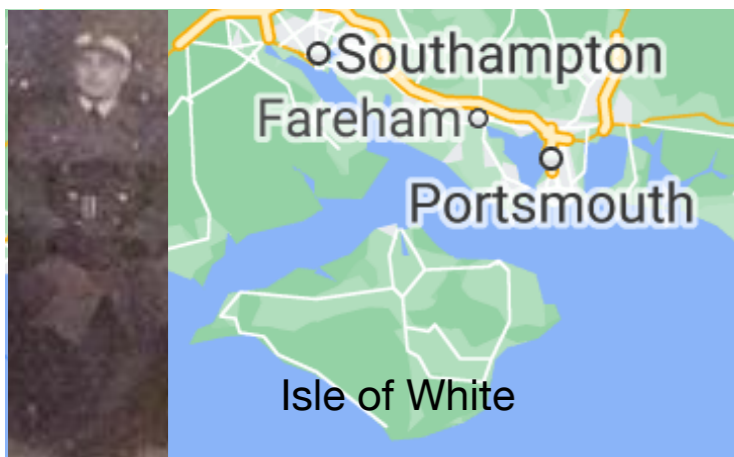
This booklet captures the names of flight cadets who lost their lives whilst in RAF service before WWII. The majority were killed in flying accidents (KFA), one died in combat (KIA) and some died in other accidents whilst serving in the RAF. Whilst we cannot be absolutely sure whether they were still in service or had retired, we also include a separate list of those flight cadets who had died of natural causes or were killed in road traffic accidents (RTA); we have added to this list those who retired from the RAF through ill health. During our research, we have managed to find some independent records and video clips that have thrown further light on the demise of Cranwellians pre-WWII; look out for underlined text and graphics, denoting the presence of a hypertext link which will provide you with more information.

Founded on information gleaned from RAF College archived records and corroborated where we can with additional sources, we assemble this tribute to pre-WWII Cranwellian casualties - "lest we forget". Very much WIP, more information will be added to this booklet when we find and verify it.

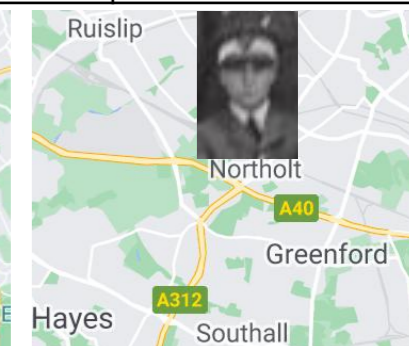
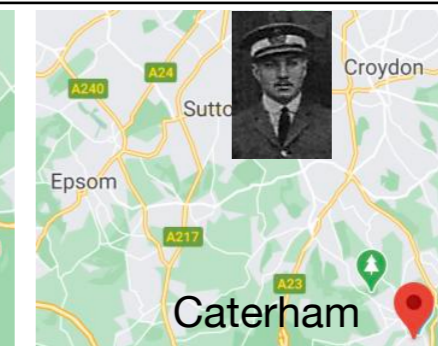
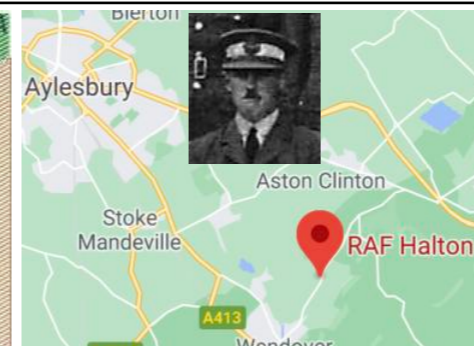
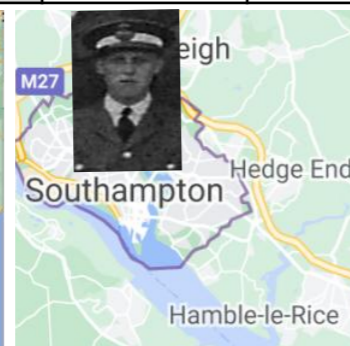

It was later re-equipped with Fairey Gordons and assumed the bomber role, Hawker Harts replacing these in 1935.
